Tour of the League City Southwest Water Reclamation Facility



The League City Southwest Water Reclamation Facility (SWWRF) was constructed on the west side of the City to replace the aging and land-constrained Countryside WWTP and serve the growing west and southwest service areas. The facility is designed to treat 4 MGD of average daily flow (ADF), with a peak two-hour flow (PF) of 12 MGD. The City opted to refer to it as a Water Reclamation Facility, as opposed to a Wastewater Treatment Plant, in order to emphasize the reuse quality water that will be generated from the facility and distributed to customers throughout the service area.

The facility features fine step screens, stacked tray grit removal, fine bubble conventional activated sludge aeration basins with anoxic bioselectors, high-speed turbo blowers, dissolved oxygen control system for energy savings, spiral blade clarifiers with energy dissipating inlets, sludge concentration rings, and brush cleaning systems, disk filters, UV disinfection, aerobic sludge holding tanks, and centrifuge dewatering. The facility is nearing completion of construction and commissioning and raw wastewater was redirected to the influent lift station in November of 2012.

Drive 3 miles and turn left on Maple Leaf Drive


Drive 1.2 miles and turn right at the dead end.
